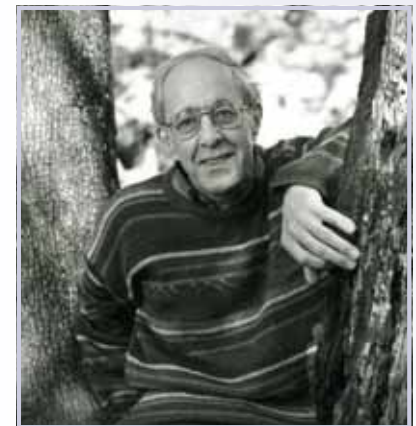

## Henri Nouwen: Life & Legacy

NEW! This weekend retreat on Nouwen's aching into holiness seems ideal for searchers keen on understanding his tireless quest for the Beloved.

There will be Nouwen readings with a focussed reflection on how life and spirituality were one, deeply incarnational, riven, but with an abiding thirst for joy.

Nouwen's reputation as a spiritual writer is credibly based on his insightful understanding of *compassion, divine and human friendship, the true meaning of the spiritual life, and the centrality of the contemplative*. Various dimensions of his life will be explored through a prayer reading of passages drawn from his journals, correspondence, and spiritual handbooks. Nouwen's personal charisma as a teacher, his astonishing gift of empathy, and his rare talent as a pastor in various and diverse settings will also be highlighted.

Nouwen is the author of many well-known books including:

- *The Return of the Prodigal Son*
- *The Wounded Healer*
- *The Road to Daybreak*



**Michael W. Higgins**, a native Torontonion, is an author, Vatican affairs specialist for the *Globe and Mail* and *CTV Network*, Catholic educator, *CBC* radio documentarian, scholar and administrator. Dr. Higgins is currently a Professor of Religious Studies and Vice-President for Mission and Catholic Identity at Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Connecticut. He has edited and co-edited, authored and co-authored numerous books, one of which is *Genius Born of Anguish: the Life and Legacy of Henri Nouwen*. He is a regular contributor to *Commonweal* and the *Literary Review of Canada* and a columnist for *The Irish Catholic*. He is the recipient of many awards, including two honorary doctorates, and won the 2013 Gold Medal for International Radio Documentaries awarded by the New York Festivals. He is a Senior Fellow at Massey College, University of Toronto, an International Fellow of the Chester Ronning Centre for Religion and Public Life, University of Alberta, and an Affiliate Graduate Professor of the Oblate School of Theology in San Antonio.
